Human Traffickimg Tips and Resources

How do I identify a potential victim?

- Accompained by another person who seems controlling or has someone in their life that is constantly monitoring them
- Signs of physical or psychological abuse
- Lacks identification
- Under 18 and providing commerical sex acts (i.e "sex" for money, gifts, etc.)
- Under 18 and intersted in or is already in a relationship with an adult
- Has a "pimp," "daddy," etc.
- Uses language from "the Life," "trick,"
 "date," "the game," etc.
- Person has tattoo or brand and is reluctant to talk about it
- Person displays secrecy, or has no knowlege of where assault occurred
- Shared phone with non-family member
- Mulitple Assailants

What do I do as an Advocate if I suspect Human Trafficking?

- Follow the victim's lead.
- Work with hospital staff to ensure best care.
- Let the victim know options about reporting if interested:
 - Report to local police department
 - Call **911** if emergency
 - Report to FBI's 24-Hour Desk:
 - 312-421-6700
 - Press 2 when prompted
 - Provide information about suspected Trafficker without disclosing own name
 - Call National Human Trafficking Hotline
 - 1-888-373-7888
 - Provide as many details as possible about type of trafficking, location, offenders, vehicles, phone numbers, debit/credit cards, etc.
- Do not promise safety!
- Call your Back UP if you need assistance!
